TEACHING STRATEGIES GOLD

- A developmental assessment we use in the classroom to help determine how students are progressing.
- Based on teacher observations
- Color bands indicate where a child should be at their age.
- You will get a report 3 times a year, at parent teacher conferences and at the end of the year.

- 9:00-9:20 or12:45-1:05
- SMART Board check in
- Mission Statement: We are here to learn and be our best!
- "I will know" board weekly color, shape, concept, letter, number and rhyme
- Review of previous concepts
- Introduction to weekly concepts
- Use TELL curriculum developed by ASU
- Language & Literacy Standards, Math Standards, Social Emotional Standards, Science Standards, Social Studies Standards, Physical Development Standards

MUSIC & ME

- 9:20-9:30 or 1:05-1:15
- 4 week themes, week 1& 2, week 3&4 are the same
- Sing songs
- Play musical instruments
- Pass baskets in a circle
- <u>Fine Arts State Standards, Social Emotional</u>
 <u>Standards</u>

TEACHER READ STORY

- 9:30-9:40 or 1:15-1:25
- A new book every week.
- Students predict what will happen, listen to the story on Monday. Students participate with reading the story Tuesday-Thursday.
- The book helper will compete an activity to sequence, or retell a story.

SMALL GROUPS

- 9:40-9:50 or 1:25-1:35
- Groups of 5 or less
- Some groups will be pulled during center time
- Usually at the tables
- Handwriting Without Tears-Letter building, workbooks
- Speech and OT will utilize this time to meet with a group of students
- Start with one small group per week, and will increase to 4 per week by the end of the year (depending on classroom needs/dynamics)
- Parent Volunteers help with small groups and monitoring students not in a small group activity.

HANDWRITING WITHOUT TEARS

- 4 types of wood pieces to build every number and letter except J and U.
- Big Curve, Big Line, Little Curve, Little Line
- Build on a mat with a smiley face in top left corner for starting position
- Capital letters only, not taught in alphabetical order
- L, F, E, H, T, I, U, C, O, Q, G, S, J, D, P, B, R, K, A, V, M, N, W, X, Y, Z
- Mat Man-head, eyes, nose, mouth, ears, body, arms, hands, legs, feet
- Use small crayons- don't be afraid to break crayons!

CENTERS

- 9:50-10:30 or 1:35-2:15
- Student's choice
- Majority of student interactions happen at this time
- Parent volunteers help monitor and interact with students during center time
- Students will be pulled to the table for a small group activity as well
- Speech therapy will join in with students to work on spontaneous speech.
- Students clean up before they are able to go to snack

SNACK

- 10:30-10:50 or 2:15-2:35
- Students wash hands and sit at table
- Sing snack song before starting
- Students serve themselves from a bowl but must ask in complete sentences for items
- Students are given a number to serve, but are able to ask for more snack until snack is gone or time is up
- Students ask to be excused and clean their spot
- We ask for a \$40 snack donation for the year or \$20 for each semester to help purchase snack items.

SNACK TIME

 - The child demonstrate the ability to give and take during social interactions

 - Participates in cleaning up the learning environment
 - Follows direction that involve one step, two steps, a series of unrelated sequences of action
 - Communicates needs, wants, and thoughts, through non-verbal gestures, actions or expressions.
 - Recites finger plays, rhymes, songs, or short poems.
 - Makes relevant responses to questions and comments from others.
 - Is understood when sharing experiences, ideas, and feelings with others through the use of language and gestures.
 - Initiates conversations
 - Uses number words in context of daily routines, activities, and play
 - Counts groups of objects using one-to-one correspondence
 - Counts a collection of up to 10 items using the last counting word to tell, "How many?"
 - Describes changes in two or more sets of objects when they are combined
 - Uses hands and fingers to manipulate a variety of tools and materials.
 - Uses eye-hand coordination to perform simple tasks.
 - Manipulates smaller objects, tools and instrument that require writes and squeezing motions.
 - Uses fine motor skills in daily living.
 - Demonstrates hygiene practices.
 - Demonstrates healthy practices: Nutrition

- Transition time between snack and group activity
- Students choose a book to read from the library
- Expected to look at a book independently
- Encouraged to tell the stories based on pictures
- Point out pictures
- Cube chairs, bean bag chair, large pillow to sit and read on
- Library is open at center time as well

- 10:55-11:10 or 2:40-2:55
- SMART Board activities
- 9 Jobs, every other day your child will have a job
- Calendar Helper, Pattern Helper, Shape Helper, Concept Helper, Color Helper, Number Helper, Letter Helper, Rhyming Helper, and Book Helper
- "What did you do today?"
- Language & Literacy Standards, Math Standards, Social Studies Standards, Social Emotional Standards, Physical Development, Healthy & Safety Standards, Fine Arts Standards

DISMISSAL

- 11:15 am or 3:00 pm
- Students get their backpacks and line up
- Walk out to the gates
 - Small gate for morning class
 - Large gate for afternoon class (go out early at the beginning of the year or if it is raining. If it is raining at PM class, we wait under the covering)
- Sign student out on clipboard
- Students stay in line until they are signed out
- Please let me know if someone else is picking up your child. They must bring ID and be on the blue card
- Please be on time!

IEP STUDENTS

- We will have an annual IEP meeting about 40 days before your student's IEP ends
- Parent Input form will be sent home and emailed to you prior to the meeting for you to fill out and return
- A draft IEP will be sent home 10 days before the meeting
- At the meeting we will discuss any changes from the draft, answer any questions about the draft, review new and old goals, services, and discuss any questions or concerns you have

BRIDGING TO KINDERGARTEN

- Students on an IEP and going to kindergarten next school year
- 1st meeting at Terramar, discuss if an evaluation is needed to determine if and what services would be appropriate for kindergarten school year
- 2nd meeting at your child's homeschool, discuss evaluation results and write the new IEP for kindergarten if your child qualifies for services.
- Home school team writes the kindergarten IEP with my input for present levels as well as your input

TYPICAL PEERS

- Tuition is due the 1st day of the month
- \$145 for 4 days per week
- \$115 for 3 days per week
- \$15 late fee if tuition is more than 5 days late
- Make checks out to DVUSD
- If there is a concern with your child's development you will be asked to take your child to a preschool screening through the district

PARENT VOLUNTEERS

- Must attend the district training, they will be held once a month in the Media Center (Library)
- If you have attended any training in the past at a Deer Valley School you do not need to take the class again (unless you want to, but we need to check the list)
- Sign in the front office and get your badge
- Help with small groups, center time, can help with copies, set up activities, what you are comfortable with
- Students love having their parents in the classroom
- Sign up online using Sign Up Genius, follow the link on the classroom website.

CONFERENCES

- Parent Teacher Conferences are held in October and March
- Discuss your child's progress in the classroom
- Teaching Strategies Gold is being used this school year, we will look at your child's data and their progress in preschool
- Sign ups will be online using Sign Up Genius

SICKNESS

- We learning about sharing in preschool but please do not share sickness! If your child is not feeling well please keep him/her at home.
- Must be fever free for 24 hours
- Preschool is not mandatory, so no truancy!
- Please call the attendance line and or email me if your child is going to be absent
